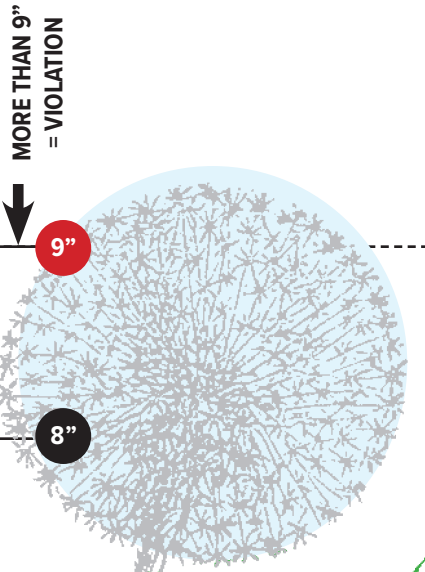

Tall Grass and Weed Program Underway

The City of Fort Wayne's Tall Grass/Weed Program is underway for Summer 2018. Neighborhood Code Compliance is responsible for enforcing the City's Weed Program, which calls for weeds or grass to be no taller than nine inches. "One property that is not mowed and looks neglected can negatively impact an entire neighborhood," said Cindy Joyner, director of Community Development. "By helping remove blighting influences, the Weed Program can help protect property values and improve the quality of life in our city."

LAWN CARE TIPS

Courtesy of Purdue Extension

- Mow grass to 3 to 3.5 inches high, which makes it less prone to insect, disease, and weed problems.
- Mow frequently and cut off no more than a third of the height. Mow when the longest grass leaves are 4 to 4.5 inches tall.
- Leave the clippings on your lawn to break down and return valuable nutrients to the soil. (But do break up clumps of clippings by raking or mowing again so they don't shade the grass.)
